

## Research Informed Initiatives



Sexual harassment can serve as an equalizer against women in power (McLaughlin et al, 2012)

Having women in leadership positions contributes towards a reduction in employee's experiences of sexual harassment in general (Au, Trembly and You, 2022).





- Bespoke Sexual Violence & Harassment training developed & delivered in EDI element for new staff induction
- Training included in SETU's Gender Equality Action Plan 2022
  - 2025

#### **TSVH Training for Staff at SETU**





- 2021 SETU EDI Office designed, developed and piloted 2-hour training programme "Tackling Sexual Violence & Harassment at SETU"
- Feedback gathered, amendments made & training delivered as part of New Staff Induction September 2022
- Targeted training provided to various Departments Dept 2022
- During Professional Development Weeks February 2022 & 2023 Training offered to all staff
- 290 staff have completed the programme over 14 sessions the roll out continues at the University on a monthly basis & is part of ongoing new staff induction

#### **Bystander Intervention**







- Bystander Intervention Programme adopted and adapted by SETU from University College Cork
- Collectively & collaboratively rolled out across SETU in the form of an engaging and instructionally deigned fully online course,
- Shared widely across the Irish university sector.

#### Bystander Intervention Microcredential at SETU



- Interactive micro-credential with 10,000 students enrolled
- Developed to tackle issues of sexual and relationship violence
- Highlights the danger of normalising abusive behaviour
- Collaborative effort among Irish universities

# What the Statistics Indicate



- Of 270 people who have taken the programme
- 76% feel this training should be compulsory while 83% feel they now have skills to intervene.





## Impact

#### Impact at SETU





- Since 2020, Active Consent training delivered to 10,000+ 1st year students over 2 campuses.
- Since 2021, 55 SETU staff have participated in Disclosure Training, delivered by Waterford Rape & Sexual Abuse Centre
- Since November 2022, EDI team delivered TSVH training to 310 staff as part of new staff induction & to all staff.
- In February 2023, SETU launched online Bystander Intervention module & 270 staff and students have completed it.
